Administrative history

The village of Moore Park was established in 1904. In 1926 the Moore Park Community Club was formed with Frank Jenner as President and Samuel Beattie as Treasurer. Over the years the club played a central role within the community both recreationally and socially. The Moore Park Community Club disbanded in 1981. At that time the records were turned over to five trustees. These trustees also continued to fulfill many of the activities of the club such as hosting bridal showers, funeral lunches, fundraising teas and facilitating hall rentals. The photograph collection of community and area families was collected for display upon the walls of Moore Park Community Hall. The event was called "Names and Faces from the Past". The Trustees included the following individuals, Doreen Jenner, Joyce Douglas, Herb Sharply, Union Sherries, and Vonda Cranswick. All past community families, except 3, were collected. After 2 years the Hall was sold and moved by Glen Kingdon approximately 12 miles straight West of Moore Park.

Scope & content

The fonds consists of six minute books, two financial ledgers, 99 photocopied photographs and 2 original photographs, cash book, detailed financial records for the Moore Park Community Club (1926 – 1975) (1945 – 1946 Moore Park curling rink fund records are on the last 3 pages). One daybook with detailed financial records for the Moore Park curling rink (1947 - 1959),

1948 Yearbook, secretary's minutes for the Moore Park Curling Club (1947 – 1959), record book with minutes of the Moore Park Red Cross Society (1939 –1945). This book also contains a stationary sample, the Annual Report of Women's Work Board (1943 – 1944) and Annual Branch Reports for 1941, 1942 and 1943. A total of four books contain the minutes and records of the Moore Park Community Club: 1945 – 1960, 1960 – 1967, 1967 – 1971, and 1972 – 1981. The 1945 – 1960 book is in fragile condition. The photographs are of Moore Park residents, church groups, sports teams, school classes, community events and some community buildings dating back as far as 1919. The majority of photographs are identified.

A neighbouring school, Marlborough school, is included with the collection. Marlborough school began in 1897 and was built on S.E. 13-13-18. Marlborough school was consolidated in 1912 and the school was moved to Moore Park and was later destroyed by fire in 1926.

Custodial history Harry Harland and Alex Pickford suggested that the minute and financial records go to the Brandon University Archives. In 2005 Doreen Jenner, one of the trustees, deposited the records at the S.J. McKee Archives at Brandon University. By the year 2006 Minnedosa had established a regional archives and on September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2007 the Moore Park Community minute and financial records were recovered from the S.J. McKee Archives by Donna Coxe and Doreen Jenner. The photo collection was held by the Minnedosa Regional Library who had received the material in 2004 also from Doreen Jenner and moved to the Minnedosa Regional Archives in 2006.
