Name of creator	Postal Clerk Mr. Thomas Boyd
Administrative history	By 1882 the postal services were contracted to Mr. Boyd by his son-in-law J. Armitage. Prior to this the correspondences were delivered and dispatched through John Tanner's stopping house from 1875 to 1880. In 1880 Mr. DeMambey took over for two years. Mail was routed via the Assiniboine River Portage to Douglas, then by horseback or stage coach. By 1883 a contract for delivering the mail 3 times a week by rail was successfully negotiated.
Custodial history	This book was housed at the Heritage Village Museum in Minnedosa until October 9, 2007 when it was accepted into the Minnedosa Regional Archives collections.
Scope & content	The collection consists of 1 record book. The book lists all registered letters sent out for Minnedosa.
